

TSRT Business Meeting

April 16, 2004

Attending the meeting were:

Barbara Bradley convened the meeting and gave a brief report on the Fall Workshop and the election results for 2004/2005. Sarah Simpson was elected Vice Chair/Chair Elect, and Crystal Giles is Secretary. Barbara passed out an evaluation summary of the fall workshop. Barbara thanked everyone for their assistance during this year and passed the torch to Michele Seikel, TSRT chair for 2004/2005. Everyone also wished to thank Barbara for the great job she did as chair during this busy year for TSRT. Sarah Simpson was kind enough to take minutes for the meeting in Crystal Giles's absence.

Michele passed out lists of past fall workshop topics and suggestions from workshop attendees for programming. She also handed out a flyer about an upcoming ILL workshop, which will be sponsored by the University and College Division. UCD has requested that we co-sponsor this workshop. It will be held this fall in early November. The group discussed the role we would play as co-sponsors, and asked Michele to check back with the UCD to see if we could play a more active role in program planning for the workshop.

SIGALO plans to offer the LC Basic Serials Cataloging Workshop this fall. They have considered asking TSRT to co-sponsor, but are concerned that they would have to charge a higher registration fee if OLA is involved. Michele will get in touch with OLA to ask about co-sponsoring, and contact SIGALO to let them know that we are interested.

During discussion about ideas for our own fall workshop, Charlotte Frazier suggested that if we co-sponsor the ILL workshop with UCD, we shouldn't create our own until next year. The group decided to move our workshop to late February or early March, since there will be at least 2 other technical services-oriented workshops this fall.

The favorite suggestion for a spring workshop:

- Purchasing records for electronic resources & making them accessible in your catalog –

Finding quality records, negotiating with vendors, importing & profiling for errors, solving compatibility problems, getting duplicate records from multiple vendors

Suggestions for OLA programming:

- Bring your own cataloging problems – invite people to bring questions, items, etc., and have experts on hand to figure out how to handle them. If people wanted to submit materials in advance, the panel could look for solutions ahead of time. This could work as a possible Table Talk.
- Physical processing (packaging, mending, vendors who supply the materials, label printing)
- Cataloging local materials, such as local history and genealogy resources that require original records

The electronic resources idea seemed to have a lot of potential for a spring workshop. We could also possibly ask the Electronic Resources group to co-sponsor.

TSRT will be meeting at Stillwater Public Library at 10:00 on Monday, May 24th in Rm. 138 to continue program planning for the coming year. Following our meeting, everyone is cordially invited to adjourn for lunch at Panera Bread. It's on Hall of Fame Ave., near the corner of Main and Hall of Fame. To get there from the library, follow Duck north to Hall of Fame, turn right and go down 2 blocks. It's on the right, next to Hastings Books & Music.
